

First performed in 1664, Tartuffe is one of Moliere's most famous comedies. Tartuffe is a vagrant wanderer who Orgon takes into his home. Tartuffe impresses Orgon with his hypocritical devout religious moral beliefs and behavior. As a result of his carefully constructed persona, Tartuffe becomes adored by Orgon and his mother, Madame Pernelle. Orgon promises his daughter's hand in marriage, even as Tartuffe attempts to seduce his wife Elmire.

#### The Sound of Music

Music by Richard Rodgers, Lyrics by Oscar Hammerstein II, Book by Howard Lindsay and Russel Crouse Apr. 7-9 & 14-17, 2022

A classic, heartwarming tale based on the real-life story of the Von Trapp family singers, *The Sound of Music* follows Maria, a postulant at an Austrian abbey who becomes a governess in the home of a widowed naval captain with seven children.
