

PBIS-ACT

What is it?

The PBIS Action and Commitment Tool (PBIS-Act) is a tool designed for schools to measure the commitment (buy-in) of staff to implement SWPBIS. The PBIS-ACT can be used by schools at various levels of implementation (pre-implementation, initial implementation, and sustaining) to determine the level of staff commitment toward implementing critical features of SWPBIS and develop action plans to ensure the broad commitment necessary to ensure success.

What are the benefits?

By using the tool, schools can gather data on staff willingness to participate in SWPBIS as well as data on the value the staff place on PBIS implementation and the degree to which they are currently implementing some PBIS strategies. This information is gathered and presented in an easy to read report that is offered free to schools. Each report provides an analysis of average responses of staff members in both chart and table formats for all individual key concepts as well as an overall summary of staff responses. Results are also summarized in terms of simple “percentage of commitment”, thereby allowing schools to compare their level of commitment to the recommended criterion of 80%.

How much time does it take?

The survey takes about 5 minutes for staff to complete.
